**Re: Delegation of Authority for Faculty Discipline and Related  
Duties**

Dear John,

Congratulations on your new role as our Vice Provost for Administrative Resolution (VPAR). Consistent with your VPAR responsibilities, we hereby delegate to you the authority to serve as the Chancellor's designee for faculty disciplinary matters. This delegation of authority stems from the Chancellor's responsibility for discipline on the campus (UC Regents Standing Order 100.6(a)). Your duties are intended to be carried out in a manner consistent with applicable University policies (especially APM-015 and APM-016), other University and Senate procedures (e.g., Bylaw 336, UCR Senate Bylaw Appendix 5) as well as UC's traditions of shared governance. This letter supersedes the previous VPAR delegation letter to your predecessor.


This delegation of authority excludes those actions that the APM specifies are non-delegable, such as the imposition of sanctions after a P&T hearing (see APM-016 pages 3-4; see also APM-100.6.d).

In addition, you are delegated with lead responsibility for handling other faculty matters that are not truly disciplinary but that have a similar quality, such as terminations under APM-075 and APM-080. Thank you for assuming these important duties in service to the UC Riverside campus.
