Delegation of Authority—Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Facilities Compliance Oversight

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) became law on July 26, 1990. This civil rights law prohibits discrimination against any "qualified individual with a disability." Title II, Subpart A, applies to the University:

No qualified individual with a disability shall, by reason of such disability, be excluded from participation in or be denied the benefits of the services, programs, or activities of a public entity or be subjected to discrimination by any such entity. The University of California does not discriminate, on the basis of handicap, against any qualified handicapped persons by excluding them from participation in, denying them the benefits of, or otherwise subjecting them to discrimination under any University program or activity.

At the University of California, Riverside campus (UC Riverside), compliance with the ADA is under the authority of the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Business and Administrative Services (BAS). The Capital Programs unit of BAS is responsible for ADA compliance issues specific to the built environment of the campus.

Effective as of the date above, I hereby delegate to the Associate Vice Chancellor-Architects & Engineers/Campus Architect, in the area of responsibility of the titled position, the authority to act on behalf of UC Riverside regarding ADA compliance matters of those properties owned or leased by the University.

This delegation is being issued due to an organization change and to enhance operational efficiencies. It may not be re-delegated.
